GOSPEL REFLECTION: Luke 9:11-17

The terms "taking the loaves," "looked up to heaven," "blessed and broke" and "gave them to the disciples" have strong Eucharistic overtones. This is not unusual for Luke in all meal accounts in his Gospel. Luke refers here both to the Eucharistic celebration of the Christian community as well as to the heavenly banquet at the end of time, especially when he mentions "all ate and were filled," and there was lots leftover. Our daily bread, the Eucharistic meal, promise fulfillment at the end of time.

1. What are for you the parallels between the Eucharist and this Gospel passage?
2. Recall special meals with others – what made these meals so special?
3. All three readings describe a real meal that obtained a deeper reality – how and when does this still happen for us today?
