REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL: – Luke 16:1-13

The parable of the dishonest manager does exactly what a good parable should do: it jars us and makes us pay attention! Here we find Jesus praising the business manager for his astute and clever ways, given that if the debtor forgave some of the debts that were owed, the customers would show further favour toward him. This is exactly what God does with us many times more, in that when we accumulate a debt of sin and ask for forgiveness God sets us free of these shackles and so we should love and praise Him evermore. Secondly Jesus points out that money is for people and should not be used vice versa. When money is used for the sake of people we to can become good stewards, when money is not used for the common good, it means we love money more than God.

- 2. How does your parish show its commitment to share its resources (financial and otherwise) with the poor?
- 3. What new practices might you personally, or your community adopt to ensure that your resources serve needs other than our own?
