REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL: - Luke 17:11-19

In a parallel to the First Reading from 2 Kings 5:14-17, this passage from the Gospel of Luke also features the healing of an outsider and a subsequent confession of faith. Both readings depict the sharp contrast between our human tendency to exclude, reject and ignore foreigners, and God's lavish showering of mercy on both insiders and outsiders, on both the grateful and the ungrateful. The bitter irony in this lesson is that if we reject God's gift of salvation, it will nevertheless be offered and even accepted by those whom we have written off as "not belonging." God's mercy will not stop at divisions and boundaries of any kind.

- 2. Who decides that some people don't belong in our society and what are some examples of this in our world today?
- 3. What does it mean to you that Jesus said: "Your faith has made you well?"
- 4. On this, Thanksgiving Weekend, what do you wish to thank God for?

FEATURED MINISTRY - BAA UPDATE

Adult Faith and Sts. Benedict and Scholastica Formation Program. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon invites us to walk forward as Pilgrims of Hope, rooted in prayer and committed to the mission of Christ. This pilgrimage is not merely a journey of individuals but of a community inspired by the Holy Spirit, seeking to live and love more deeply through formation, discernment, and service. Among the ministries that embody this vision is the Ministry of Adult Faith and the dynamic witness of the Sts. Benedict and Scholastica Formation House. Both formational paths remind us that every baptized Christian is called to be a missionary disciple, offering their unique gifts in the service of the Gospel.

Adult Faith ministry and the Sts. Benedict and Scholastica Formation Program are rooted in prayer and in the teachings of the Catholic Church, seeking to equip missionary disciples attentive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. This past year, the Called and Gifted program, which is an integral part of Adult Faith ministry in the diocese, brought discernment and empowerment to over 150 participants, including those from rural Saskatchewan and as far as the Philippines. Workshops help lay people recognize the charisms the Holy Spirit has entrusted to them and challenge them to go forth and serve. Likewise, young adults engaged in the Sts. Benedict and Scholastica Formation Program are deepening their apostolic identity through leadership training, parish ministry, and acts of service. Their lives are a living response to Pope Francis' words in Evangelii Gaudium: "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus." The Bishop's Annual Appeal plays a vital role in this mission, funding programs that awaken, equip, and send forth disciples.
